### Process

### 1) Digitization

- Scanning of the three language version
- Editing with the Transkribus platform
- Correcting of some pages and training of the OCR models
- Correcting of OCR errors
- Establishing transcription guidelines

### 2) Enrichment

- Structuring of the XML TEI text
- Enriching with entities (place, name, institution etc.)
- Coding of phrases of particular subject interest (e.g. concepts related to social work and history).
- Enabling parallel reading in the three editions by aligning sections at paragraph level

### 3) Publishing the edition

- Online hosting of the digital edition in a TEI Publisher environment
- Providing XML TEI version for open access


### Meaning
